# **Pardubice Region**

### Smetana's Litomyšl – a centre of culture

Not only does Litomyšl host one of the oldest music festivals in the country, it is also a place where culture and history come together.

Litomyšl is not only the focal point of the Smetana's Litomyšl music festival; it is also home to numerous historical and cultural heritage sites. The town's "Renaissance fairy tale set to music", as the chateau in Litomyšl is known as, is rightfully listed as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site. The festival takes place in the chateau, as well as in churches around Litomyšl, in Smetana's house and also regularly in the chateau in Nové Hrady. During the festival, the town comes alive with classical music, as well as accompanying programmes featuring theatre performances, special tours and other activities. The shows on offer at the music festival are complemented every year by Smetana's Creative Litomyšl, a series of art exhibitions focused mainly on local work.

# Puppeteers' Chrudim, not only during the festival

The puppet festival has been held since 1951, making it the oldest constantly running puppet theatre festival in the world. However, Chrudim is a town of puppets all year round.

During the festival there are several puppet shows to see every day, as well as creative workshops and themed lectures on puppetry and puppet making. It also includes an accompanying programme featuring performances and concerts, which bring the whole town to life.

If you're planning a trip to Chrudim, check out the Museum of Puppet Culture, which is housed in a Renaissance building dating from the 16th century and is home to 8,500 puppets from all over the world (such as Africa, Japan and Vietnam).

### Carnival processions in the Hlinsko region

The Hlinsko region's colourful masked carnival is a unique cultural tradition that is passed down from generation to generation. You can see it every year during the carnival season.

In the villages around Hlinsko, the tradition of carnival processions dates back to the 19th century. That's why this custom was listed by UNESCO in 2010. The carnival is a time of merriment and feasting. The processions see traditional masks and rituals come to life. Each mask plays its own role, and the procession includes Straw Men, chimney sweeps and other characters. The masquerades go around the entire village, wishing everyone good luck and health. In return they're offered something to eat and drink.

The Betlém Hlinsko conservation area hosts a permanent exhibition of carnival masks and processions. It includes photos, original masks and other interesting exhibits.

## **Lughnasad Festival of Celtic Culture**

This holiday, named after the god Lugh, is celebrated every year at the turn of July and August - at the beginning of the harvest. It commemorates the history, culture and customs of the Celtic tribes.

Lughnasad is one of the largest festivals of its kind in Central Europe, with each year telling a different historical story. The celebration is traditionally held to thank Mother Earth for the harvest. The festival includes a lavish historical and musical programme, talks, workshops, a fighting tournament and a skills competition.

The festival takes place in the Land of the Celts, in the beautiful Iron Mountains, which were formerly settled by the Celts. The site is a reconstruction of a Celtic oppidum. The local Celtic settlement is presented through guided tours from April to October, and the open-air museum can also be visited at other time on request.

#### Velká Pardubická

The Velká Pardubická steeplechase is probably the most important social and sports event hosted by the city of Pardubice. It is one of the most demanding races in Europe and has been run since 1874.

When they hear the word Pardubice, many people think of the famous horse race. The Velká Pardubická takes place on the second Sunday of October every year; this year will be 133rd steeplechase. The Velká Pardubická is preceded by a total of 4 qualifier races. In order for a horse to race in October's Velká Pardubice, it must complete at least one of the four qualifier races on the Pardubice track and finish in at least 5th place, or no more than 20 seconds after the winner. That's what makes the qualifiers so interesting for the spectators. Boxes can also be hired for a truly unforgettable experience. They offer great views and comfortable seating. They also provide catering tailored to suit your needs.

# **Liberec Region**

#### **Anifilm**

International Festival of Animated Films. That's the best way to describe Anifilm, which has been held in Liberec in North Bohemia for four years now. The event, the most important of its kind in Central Europe and the only international competitive festival centred around animated film in the Czech Republic, annually presents hot news from the animated film world and strives to promote its cultural heritage and name on an international scale.

During the several days of the festival, the audience is presented with a number of animated works from artists from the Czech Republic and abroad, divided into seven international competition categories. This means that filmmakers compete against one another in the feature, short or student film sections, accompanied by competitions for abstract and non-narrative animation, video clips, virtual reality, computer games and national animated creations - Czech Horizon. The films are then evaluated by an international panel of three judges, who themselves are involved in preparing the festival programme and add an insight through their work or talks.

#### **Glass memories**

History and tradition play a special role in the Liberec region, reflecting its rich heritage and character. The region, which takes pride in its many years of glass making and processing, strives to keep the craft still alive and holds culturally significant events to present the work of its skilled glassmakers to the world.

One of these is the IGS - International Glass Symposium in Nový Bor. For 14 years now, this important artistic festival has attracted works of art and unique items from more than six hundred glassmakers from around the world, and besides showcasing these works, the event also presents links that glass shares with sculpture, design and architecture. Another important event that enriches the region's cultural life every three years is the Jablonec Triennial. Held in the Museum of Glass and Jewellery in Jablonec nad Nisou, it attracts glass enthusiasts and other visitors interested in keeping up with current trends in utility glass and jewellery.

All the glassworks in the region are connected from one end to the other by the Crystal Valley, the heart of the region's glassmaking industry, which strives to promote and glorify the craft. In addition to smaller events, it also organises the Crystal Valley Week, which sees the entire region transformed into a glass paradise, presenting glass in all its forms - from glassmaking demonstrations right there on the street to exhibitions and fashion shows.

#### Jizerská 50

#### Mahler – the Music of Thousands

The international music festival Mahler Jihlava - Music of the Thousands has been held regularly in Jihlava since 2001, from May to July – marking the anniversaries of the death and birth of Gustav Mahler.

Every year, the festival offers a marathon of concerts featuring prominent guests from the Czech Republic and abroad, as well as a varied accompanying programme, including the traditional planting of roses in the Mahler Rosary in Kaliště and themed trips around Mahler's Vysočina. The festival focuses on the work of Gustav Mahler and accentuates the link between Czech and Austrian musical culture.

Concerts are mainly held in the Church of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, the Gothic Hall of the Town Hall, the Culture House, the Horák Theatre, in Gustav Mahler Park and other places. Part of the programme is always hosted in Mahler's native Kaliště near Humpolec as well as in other towns around Vysočina and Lower Austria.

Hops have been grown in Žatec and the surrounding area for more than seven hundred years. The town became a hop metropolis, and the local hops were used to make some of the most famous beer brands.

The traditional festivities are accompanied by music and entertainment on eight stages throughout the town. Besides the main square, náměstí Svobody, and náměstí Prokopa Velkého, you can have fun in the Monastery Garden, in the summer amphitheatre, in the Žatec Brewery or on Hošťálkovo náměstí.

Interesting accompanying events are hosted by the Temple of Hops and Beer and the exhibition held in the Homolupulů Museum, with the oldest brewer Lojza Lupulín in the Hussite bastion. Hop and beer competitions are an integral part of the festival. The most popular is picking hops by hand and dancing with a tankard of beer on one's head. Another interesting attraction is the "live picture", when the hops are pulled from the "smallest hop farm in the world", which is right next to the main stage on náměstí Svobodv.

The event is part of the 'Family Silver' legacy of the Ústí Region and has been awarded a Clean Festival certificate.

### Josephine Festival in the Terezín fortress

The Josephine Festival is a tribute to Maria Theresa and the fortress itself and is held at Terezín every year at the beginning of October. The festival commemorates the foundation of the fortress in 1780 is set entirely in the 18th century.

The festivities have a single goal, to commemorate the unique fortress of Terezín and the events that led up to its construction. It is one of Europe's biggest celebrations focused on this period. Every year, people from the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Germany, Poland, France, Austria, Russia, Serbia and other countries gather for the event.

During the festival, visitors return to the era of brightly coloured uniforms and lace, to the time of gunpowder and feminine elegance. They walk through military camps, marketplaces, admire old crafts and savour the time of bygone centuries.

During the day, there is a real conquest of the fortress amid the roar of soldiers, including a historical battle at night. Everyone can walk along Terezín's walls, explore its underground and taste something really unusual.

The country's biggest stylish celebration is held in the historical town of Úštěk to mark the national holiday on October 28 and the establishment of the Czechoslovak Republic. The event begins with the arrival of TG Masaryk and his entourage and his speech.

The square in Úštěk is transformed into a magnificent historical marketplace packed with beautiful stalls selling traditional products and craft demonstrations. Music is provided by retro bands, and puppet and street theatre shows provide a cultural backdrop. You can try the historical shooting range and see an exhibition of items and retro toys from the First Republic.

### **ROSA festivities in Sedlčany**

Sedlčany's traditional town festivities commemorating the alleged victory of Sedlčany's troops over Žižka - a historical and entertaining event with fireworks on the square.

The "ROSA" festival in the town of Sedlčany continue the tradition of religious festivities, which probably originated at the end of the 17th century and were held every year to mark the Easter holidays. These festivities are held to commemorate the alleged victory over Žižka in 1420. Legend has it that Žižka decided to ambush the people of Sedlčany - who were faithful to the Catholic Church - on the night before the Easter holidays, and sent a messenger to Benešov, so that the townspeople would also march with their army against the people of Sedlčany, and at the appointed hour they joined him in attacking the town. However, the messenger got lost, and instead of arriving in Benešov he came to Sedlčany, where he delivered his message, believing that he was in the right place. This obviously revealed the plot. This enabled the people of Sedlčany to prepare for the attack and they defeated Žižka in a battle near the fortified St. Martin's Church "in the morning dew".



### The Travelling Golden Pan of the Mayor of **Zlaté Hory (Gold Mountains)**

Since 1994, the Goldfields Open-Air Museum in Zlaté Hory has been hosting the gold panning event "The Travelling Golden Pan of the Mayor of Zlaté Hory". Every year, visitors can enjoy stands selling various products, live music, refreshments and, of course, a gold panning school.

As gold has been found in the surroundings of Zlaté Hory (the village's name translates as Gold Mountains), the tradition of gold panning competitions was established in 1994. The competitions are organised by the town of Zlaté Hory together with the Moravian-Silesian Gold Diggers Club.

After the success of the European Championships in 1996, the Czech and Slovak Championships in 2001, 2005, 2009, 2016 and 2022, the World Gold Panning Championship was also held in 2010 and will again be held in the Goldfields Open-Air Museum in 2024.

The competition held in Zlaté Hory has also led to the tradition of the competition for the Mayor's Travelling Golden Pan. According to the rules, each winner holds it for 1 year and defends their victory in the following year.

The gold panning competition in Zlaté Horv is held once a year, every August, and 2023 was the twenty-eighth year.

### Wallenstein Festival in Cheb

Every year at the end of August, a magnificent historical celebration kicks off with the arrival of Albrecht von Wallenstein in Cheb. The Wallenstein Festival includes festive parades during the day and by torchlight at night, fairy-tale performances for children, a historical fair on the square, falconry demonstrations, period music and dancing, as well as an evening celebration with fireworks, a thrilling reenactment of the events of Wallenstein's last stay, and reconstructions of battle skirmishes.

### Tábor Meetings international historical festival

The largest mediaeval festival in Central Europe, attracting 20,000 visitors. The historical centre of Tábor as well as several squares, the town's winding streets and the rich greenery behind the walls all come alive for three days with the ancient history of the early 15th century.

Back when Hussite commander Jan Žižka of Trocnov took control of the town, and now, almost six hundred years later, the famous captain of the people symbolically assumes the rule of Tábor every year. This is all accompanied by a crowd of his Hussite warriors arriving to the beating of drums and the light of torches.

After the ceremonial opening, it's entirely up to you whether you try some mead and bread with pork rind from a stall or would prefer some choice mediaeval delicacies in one of the cosy taverns. The programme "menu" is also endless - fireworks; parades in historical costumes; a mediaeval fair; a beggar's alley; concerts of spiritual, mediaeval and contemporary music; performances by historical fencing groups; a tournament of knights on horseback; open-air theatre; exhibitions; games and competitions for children.

The country's biggest theatre show has its home in Hradec Králové. It hosts a popular festival every year, presenting performances by artists from the Czech Republic and abroad at more than 30 venues around the city for one week.

The Regions festival is a wholly unique, vibrant event reflecting a rich cross-section of current culture from home and abroad. The entire city is suddenly transformed from a still and slow-moving setting into a living mechanism, a single interconnected performance that runs through the city's parks, streets, walls and, last but not least, its people. It is an amazing cultural experience and for many ensembles is a traditional event to mark the end of the theatre season.

### **Rock for People**

One of the Czech Republic's biggest rock festivals, held since 1995. Park 360 at the former military airfield site in Hradec Králové has hosted it since 2007. It is now a hugely popular festival that attracts music fans from all over Europe.

The festival now lasts four days and the main headliners are some of the top names on the music scene. The festival has long been committed to sustainability and aims to be a self-sufficient site by 2030. The individual stages are powered by photovoltaic panels or hydrogen. A far wider range of on-site waste is sorted than just plastic, paper and municipal waste. In addition, there is an increasing number of meat-free meals available at the food stands.

### **Červený Kostelec Folklore Festival**

The festival with the longest tradition in the Czech Republic, featuring performances by some 600 dancers and musicians from all over the world. The five-day festival is packed with folk events, fairs, handicraft workshops and entertainment.

Over those five days, around 600 dancers and musicians from some 16-20 folklore ensembles from around the world perform in fifteen varied blocks of shows. The shows in the amphitheatre generally attract thousands of visitors, as do the parades and ensemble performances held in various parts of the town and region. The evening blocks end with fun and dancing for the general public, with the performers boogying on down with the audience on the dance floor.

### Battle of 1866 at Chlum

The decisive battle between Austria and Prussia was fought on 3 July 1866 on Chlum hill just a few kilometres from the main regional city of Hradec Králové. In terms of the number of troops engaged in combat, this was the second biggest battle on Czech soil during the 19th century.

Over 430,000 soldiers were involved, more than 53,000 of whom were killed, wounded, captured or went missing. Every year, commemorative events are held to mark the anniversary of the conflict, rounded off with a large reenactment of the battle featuring associations and groups from all over Europe and sometimes even further afield. Pyrotechnics and technical support make this a very lively combat demonstration. Today, the former battlefield is dotted with more than 400 memorials to the fallen soldiers.

### **Czech Long Trail**

it is almost 30 years since dog sled-racing enthusiasts decided to hold their own race, choosing the Eagle Mountains for the region's excellent snow conditions.

Two tracks were created for the race - 200 km and 300 km, which run along the Czech and Polish sides of the Eagle Mountains. Over the years, what was originally a local race has become a Europe-wide competition, proof of which can be seen in the fact that the FISTC European Championship is held here. The race regularly includes competitors and dog teams from abroad.


